
"HOPE CAN CHANGE EVERYTHING" APPEAL

New Grant Opportunities

There are enormous opportunities for Rhema 99.9 this year to secure new Community Broadcasting Foundation (CBF) radio sector grant funding that may not have been successful if applied for in previous rounds.

The main reason for this is due to the station developing a formal 5 year strategic plan last year. CBF have restructured their grant application process that requires all applicants to have a strategic plan put in place to enable a positive outcome and successfully qualify for grant funding. This is because the restructure involves every community radio station to apply for the various grants offered for the upcoming 12 months in a single application. The good news is that Rhema 99.9 now has a 5 year strategic plan with which we can demonstrate to the CBF a solid direction for the growth and sustainability for the station that necessary funding can provide. Please pray with us for wisdom as we seek God for His leading and guidance for a successful grant application process.


Introducing our Treasurer, Ulrich
