

For months prior he would assure us that his life expectancy had not changed because he knew he was in the Lord's hands.

Ulrich served faithfully on the Board of Directors at Rhema 99.9 since 2017 and his presence at the station will be greatly missed. Our deepest sympathies go out to his wife, Christine.

Becoming a Powerful Man

The word virtue is not generally associated with men. But it has a rather interesting meaning. It is derived from the latin *virtus* which generally means "power", while vir has the connotation of husband or man. Therefore, to become a real man you need to become strong in virtue. A virtuous man is a "powerful man".

At the time when Jesus came to earth, the Jews were expecting a king who would overthrow their oppressors, the Romans. Jesus was the King they were expecting but they didn't recognise Him.

Jesus appeared as a servant. A "powerful man" is a servant. So when the Bible says "For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the Head of the church" (Eph. 5:23), it means that if you are to be head of your home, you must become a servant like Christ.

Do Aussies Actually Listen to Christian Radio?

The latest data from McNair yellowSquares indicates that almost 100,000 more people are listening to Christian Radio in Australia compared to last year.

The Community Radio Listener Survey is a survey of the community radio listening habits of Australians.

It is a hybrid telephone and online survey of a representative sample of 16,000 Australians over the age of 15, across all Australian states and territories and is coordinated on behalf of the entire Community Broadcasting sector, through the CBAA. The survey is conducted by McNair yellowSquares, an accredited Australian market and social research organisation with a long history of media research dating back to the first radio audience surveys held in the 1930s.

Christian radio listening figures are a measure of both Australian Christian Community Radio Stations and the Vision Radio Network.

The latest data for January 2022 has been released and reports that 1,886,000 Australians are now listening to Christian radio each week (up from 1,790,000 in the previous survey).

They spend 9.5 hours listening to Christian radio each week (up from 9.1 hours), and where most radio listeners will switch between a few stations that they listen to, 170,000 listeners say they exclusively listen to Christian radio (up from 143,000).

So do Aussies actually listen to Christian radio?

The answer is a resounding YES!



Did you know there is a simple way to play Rhema through your smartphone?

- 2. For **Android** users say:

"Hey Google - listen to Rhema 99.9 Port Macquarie".

For **iPhone** users say:

"Hey Siri - listen to Rhema 99.9 Port Macquarie".

Your phone should respond quickly and the album cover of the song currently playing should appear on your screen. For a great sound, hook your phone to a Bluetooth speaker.
